TAKING CARE OF YOUR OAK TACK CABINET

Your oak cabinet has an oiled finish, so is well protected, but not completely impervious to marking. If you'd like to avoid any chance of obvious marking, any spills should be wiped immediately, and you should avoid dragging objects across the surface.

CLEANING

Use a soft, lightly dampened cloth to wipe the cabinet clean from time to time. You can also use the Osmo spray cleaner provided to clean and nourish the timber.

CARE

Over time, your cabinet will build up the rich, warm patina of time and use. To ensure the longevity of the piece, and the continued beauty of the surface, we would suggest that the cabinet is re-oiled if you notice the surface becoming dry or it's marking too easily.

ENVIRONMENT

Your cabinet is made from solid timber, and as a natural material will never stop responding to its environment. This is wonderful thing! However, it does mean that fast, extreme or imbalanced changes in temperature or humidity, may affect the structure and longevity of the piece and should be avoided.
